
Prayer One

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.


Prayer Two


Reflection

Final Prayer


God our Father, help us to remember that when you were dividing up the important jobs, you didn't leave anybody out.
