

This Sunday's Gospel 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A (Matthew 16: 21-27)

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord;' he said 'this must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? 'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

Reflection:

Our theme this week (Start the Journey) is inspired by the fact that we are starting a new school year, and it links to this week's Gospel reading In this week's Gospel, Jesus is talking about discipleship. In other words, he is talking about what it means to follow him. It's not easy. In fact, although the pros far outweigh the cons in the long run, it can be very difficult to be a Christian.

Jesus says: 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it'

These are difficult words in some ways, but not to be taken entirely literally. Jesus doesn't want us to hate our lives or to give up everything that we love, and he doesn't want us to take on unnecessary burdens just to prove ourselves. But he does want us to put our faith in him above everything else.

Reflection:
